About Us

Bob Jones Academy is an independent school serving students in preschool through grade 12. Founded in 1927, BJA is well known for its excellent Christian education. All faculty are certified through the South Carolina Association of Christian Schools (SCACS); 60 percent of all faculty (70 percent of secondary teachers) have advanced degrees. BJA enjoys high faculty retention and experience—75 percent of faculty have 10 or more years of classroom experience, and many faculty members have also authored textbooks or developed online courses.

Academic Program

In BJA's college preparatory high school program, classes are 50 minutes long and meet five days a week. Twenty-four credits are required for high school graduation. In addition to a full slate of rigorous college prep courses, BJA offers an honors track—both math and science—and general courses in the core areas. BJA has a robust dual-credit program through its affiliated nationally accredited college, Bob Jones University.

Grading Scale

BJA uses the standard South Carolina grading scale:

A, 93-100; B, 85-92; C, 77-84; D, 70-76; F, 0-69. BJA calculates both a weighted (South Carolina Uniform Grading Scale) GPA and an unweighted GPA. The weighted SCUGS GPA is used to calculate class rank. In the SCUGS, honors courses receive an additional .5 quality point and dual-credit courses receive an additional 1 quality point.

Honors Courses

Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II, PreCalculus, Biology, Chemistry, Introductory Physics, Intermediate Physics, Biotechnology, and Genetics and Christian Ethics

Dual-Credit Courses

Common classes taken include the following: Composition & Rhetoric, Composition & Literature, History of Civilization, Intermediate Spanish, Principles of Accounting I and II, Fundamentals of Speech, Introduction to Criminal Justice, Calculus I, Foundations of Exercise Science & Sport, Introduction to Engineering, Photography I, Principles of Marketing, Introduction to Computer Programming, Introduction to Interior Design.

Extracurricular Program

BJA's high school extracurricular program includes a robust forensics and mock trial program as well as strong fine arts and athletic opportunities.

- Activities: student body officers, class officers, *Academian* (yearbook) staff, *Triangle* (newspaper) staff, forensics, mock trial and stage crew
- Community outreach: New York mission trip, community work days, visits to special needs settings (e.g., nursing home)
