Bob Jones Academy is an independent school serving students in preschool through grade 12. Founded in 1927, BJA is well known for its excellent Christian education. All faculty members are certified through the South Carolina Association of Christian Schools (SCACS); over 50 percent of all faculty have advanced degrees. ## Academic Program

Twenty-four credits are required for graduation. In BJA's college-preparatory high school program, classes are 50 minutes long and meet five days a week. In addition to a full slate of rigorous college prep courses, BJA offers an honors track—math and science—and general courses in the core areas. BJA has a robust dual-credit program through its affiliated regionally accredited college, Bob Jones University.

## Grading Scale

BJA uses the standard South Carolina Grading Policy:

A, 90–100; B, 80–89; C, 70–79; D, 60–69; F, 0–59.

BJA calculates a weighted (South Carolina Uniform Grading Policy) GPA. The weighted SCUGP GPA is used to calculate class rank. In the SCUGP, honors courses receive an additional 0.5 quality point and dual-credit courses receive an additional 1 quality point.

## Honors Courses

## Dual-Credit Courses

Common classes taken include the following: Calculus I, Calculus II, Composition & Literature, Composition & Rhetoric, Computer Science Foundations, Fundamentals of Counseling, Fundamentals of Speech, General Psychology, History of Civilization, Intermediate Spanish, Introduction to Business, Introduction to Criminal Justice, Introduction to the Arts, Photography I, Principles of Accounting I and II, Principles of Marketing, Survey of French Literature, Themes in Western Thought.

## Extracurricular Program

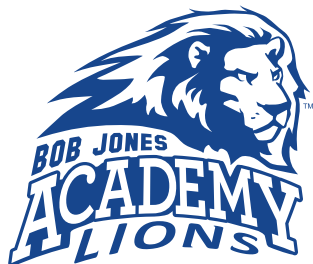
BJA's high school extracurricular program includes a robust forensics and mock trial program as well as strong fine arts and athletic opportunities.
