

The Wilds Senior Class Trip Oct. 5 – 9, 2020

The senior class trip is designed to give you a time to grow closer with your classmates and most importantly to grow closer with God. Your experience at The Wilds will help you as upperclassmen better lead and serve the student body.

We have the campsite to ourselves for this week with a program that is specifically designed for you, BJA's seniors. In an effort to make fellowship with the Lord and each other as easy as possible, we've done our best to limit outside distractions (such as smartphones) and give you plenty of opportunities for fun and growth. With this focus in mind, we ask that visitors not be encouraged to come.

So, pack well, get your schoolwork in order and be prepared for a very relaxing, enjoyable and memorable time with the Class of 2021!

#### 1. Preparing for the trip

- a. If you are working, make arrangements with your employer immediately since all seniors are expected to go on the trip.
- b. If you are enrolled in any classes that are not specifically senior courses, see your teachers very soon to get the assignments for the week of the trip. You normally will need to make up the work for Academy courses before you go on the trip.
- c. If you are enrolled in a BJU class, you will want to check your syllabus for instructions about absences.
- d. If you wish to leave your car parked on campus while you are gone, you may leave it in the area designated for regular Academy parking. If there is no parking permit on your car, secure a temporary parking permit in advance from a Public Safety employee at the University's main entrance.

#### 2. What to bring

- Bible (print), notebook and pen
- Bedding, pillow, towels, toiletries, alarm clock, watch
- Warm clothes (for cool evenings)
- Tennis shoes
- Water shoes/sandals
- Rain gear
- Plastic bag (for wet clothing on the return trip)
- Spending money (for Cool Beans, The Craft Shop, The Snack Shop and The General Store)
- Insect repellant

You may bring one suitcase, sleeping bag, pillow and backpack. Girls may also bring a cosmetic case. Be sure to put your name on all your belongings, including your bedding and pillow.

## 3. What not to bring

ENO/hammocks, items such as smartphones, radios, iPods, video cameras, guitars or magazines.

## 4. Leaving campus

- a. Meet in front of Academy Main promptly at 3:40 p.m. to begin loading the buses. Pillows and backpacks will be carried on the bus.
- b. Luggage: Bring your sleeping bag and one piece of luggage to the lobby of the Academy Auditorium when you arrive at school on Monday. All luggage will be transported separately on a truck.

Guys	
Bus Trips*	Casual attire (jeans, T-shirt)
<b>Evening Services</b>	Collared shirts and long pants/jeans
Activities	Knee-length shorts or jeans
Water Activities	T-shirt and pants or knee-length shorts

<sup>\*</sup>Because it is a regular school day for others, students wearing casual attire must stay in front of the Main until departure.
