## About Us

Bob Jones Academy is an independent school serving students in preschool through grade 12. Founded in 1927, BJA is well known for its excellent Christian education. BJA enjoys high faculty experience, education and retention. All faculty members are certified through the South Carolina Association of Christian Schools (SCACS). Over 50 percent of faculty have advanced degrees. Over 75 percent of faculty have 10 or more years of classroom experience, and many faculty members have also authored textbooks or developed online courses.

## Mission Statement

## Academic Program

Twenty-four credits are required for graduation. In the high school program, classes are 50 minutes long and meet five days a week. In addition to a full slate of rigorous college prep courses, an honors track — math and science — and general courses in the core areas are offered. A robust dual-credit program is offered through its affiliated regionally accredited college, Bob Jones University.

## Grading Scale

BJA uses the standard South Carolina Grading Policy:

A, 90–100; B, 80–89; C, 70–79; D, 60–69; F, 0–59.

A weighted (South Carolina Uniform Grading Policy) GPA is used to calculate class rank. In the SCUGP, honors courses receive an additional 0.5 quality point, and dual-credit courses receive an additional 1 quality point.

## Honors Courses

## Dual-Credit Courses

Common classes taken include the following: Calculus I, Calculus II, Composition & Literature, Composition & Rhetoric, Fundamentals of Counseling, Fundamentals of Speech, General Psychology, Intermediate Spanish, Introduction to Business, Introduction to Criminal Justice, Introduction to the Arts, Making of the Modern World, OT Literature and Interpretation, NT Literature and Interpretation, Principles of Accounting I and II, Principles of Marketing, Themes in Western Thought.

## Extracurricular Program

The high school program includes extracurricular opportunities to develop students spiritually, physically, creatively and socially.

- Activities: Student body officers, class officers, *Academician* (yearbook) staff, *Triangle* (newspaper) staff, speech and debate, mock trial and stage crew
- Community outreach: Mission trip, community work days, visits to special needs settings (e.g., nursing home)

## Fine Arts Program

The high school fine arts program builds on instruction at the elementary and middle school levels.

- Extracurricular opportunities: Private and group instrument and vocal lessons
- Performances: Semester concerts, community performances
- Awards: Superior ratings at festivals and competitions

- Extracurricular opportunities: Speech & Debate team, Mock Trial team
- Performances: School plays, speech competitions
- Awards: I A Speech & Debate state champions; nationally recognized coaches; previous state and national Mock Trial champions

- Classes: Introductory and Advanced Art, Introduction to Graphic Design
- Projects: Group and individual work in two- and three-dimensional media
- Competitions: School art show, Scholastic Arts Competition, various other opportunities
